## PARENT REPRESENTATIVES


Seeking regular ongoing feedback from our parents and carers is essential to the continuing development of Barlows Primary School. In order to strengthen communication between the school and its families, I am looking to establish a group of willing volunteers from our parental community to meet with me every half term and form a group of **Parent Representatives**.

My aim is to have at least one parent representative from every class in the school from Nursery through to Year 6. They will act as point of contact for parents and carers in that class and relay items for discussion to me during our half-termly meetings. Equally, the parent representatives will reinforce key messages coming out from the school to parents and carers.

In terms of time commitment, meetings usually take place every 5-6 weeks and last for approximately one hour.

Some parents and carers have already expressed an interest in joining the group at my meeting last week. If you were unable to attend but are interested in becoming a representative, please look out for the letter going out through the Barlows' app. You will be able to register your interest by responding to the questionnaire.
