## Family Learning Projects



This year we are launching an opportunity for pupils to engage in learning at home on a topic of their choice through '**Family Learning Projects**'.

Pupils select to complete a project on a topic of their choice. This can be anything from baking something at home to interviewing a family member about their memories of Liverpool in the past.

We will set up our school hall on a specified afternoon, with a booth for each child where they can display their project. During the afternoon, other classes will visit the hall and pupils will be able to ask questions about each child's project. We will also hold a session for parents and carers to view the projects just before the end of the day.

As a school, we are very happy for each child to work alongside family members in putting their project together. A great deal can be gained from such quality time with an adult. Presenting their project also provides children with an opportunity develop their **speaking skills**. An important aspect of supporting your child with the project is preparing them to answer questions about it.

Each year group from Year 1 to Year 6 will complete one project per year and these will be spread over the three terms. The first year groups working on the projects are **Year 5 and Year 6**. They will be presenting their projects in school during the first week back in **January 2019**. Letters have already been sent home regarding this. If you have a child in these year groups and have not received a letter, please contact the class teacher.

Year 3 and Year 4 will start work on their projects in the Spring term and present them after the Easter break. Year 1 and Year 2 will start work on theirs in the Summer term and present them in July. A letter regarding the project work will be sent out closer to the time, explaining the expectations in more detail and the dates for the presentations.
