Holidays in term time remain unauthorised and may receive a penalty notice.

As you are aware, all children should be aiming for 100%. We have set the school target at 98% although all pupils should aim to achieve 100% attendance.

Thank you in advance for working with us to achieve the school target this academic year.

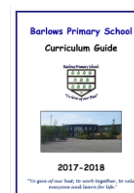


### Themed Weeks

We would like to say a special thank you to everyone who donated.

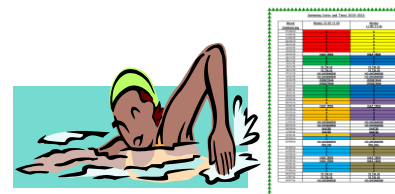
The items of food were sent to the North Liverpool Food bank, who will distribute the food to families in need across north Liverpool.

In line with our Healthy Schools Status, fizzy or sugary drinks are not permitted at lunchtime.

### Water Bottles

Each child is provided with a school water bottle which are cleaned and sterilised regularly.

Therefore, children do not need to bring their own water bottle in to school as one is provided.





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### Morning Snack

Pupils in Year 3,4,5 and 6 are welcome to bring a healthy morning snack into school to be consumed at snack time .

Children are allowed to bring any one of the following in line with our Healthy schools' Status:

- A single round of toast (ideally wrapped in foil) chocolate spread or jam should not be included
- Cereal bar (non chocolate)
- Fruit - whole or in pieces (not in syrup)
- 1 crumpet
- 1 bagel (without a filling)
- 1 teacake



Grapes - in the interest of safety and guidance previously received by the school, if you supply your child with grapes for school, we would be grateful if these can be cut in half (length ways) to avoid the possibility of choking.



Pupils in Early Years and Key Stage 1 receive free fruit as part of the national fruit scheme and therefore do not need to bring an additional snack in to school.

### Peanuts

As you are aware, some children and adults suffer from peanut allergies. This can include an allergic reaction to peanuts in their vicinity without directly consuming these.

We would be grateful if you could support us in not sending peanuts in to school as part of lunch or snack.



### School Car Park

Please be reminded that the school car park should not be used unless you are dropping off or collecting from Morning Club/After School Club or the Children's Centre.

Please do not use the school car park or car park entrance in any other circumstances as this causes unnecessary queues which in the event of an emergency, can cause delays in emergency vehicles being able to access the site. It also prevents staff from being able to park in the allocated staff parking areas.



There have also been a number of near misses with parents backing out of parking spaces unable to see owing to the quantity of vehicles blocking the entry and exit routes.



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### Eco Committee - Litter Picks

Our Eco Committee have been working hard to promote a litter free site. They have been supporting our caretaker, Mr McCartney, carrying out litter picks with specialist equipment as part of a 'Big tidy Up'.

### Music at Barlows

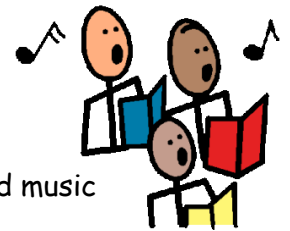
Our new Music Coordinator, Mrs Stephanie Webster, has been working extremely hard to engage more pupils in music opportunities outside the curriculum.
