Liverpool Football Club Safer Internet Day

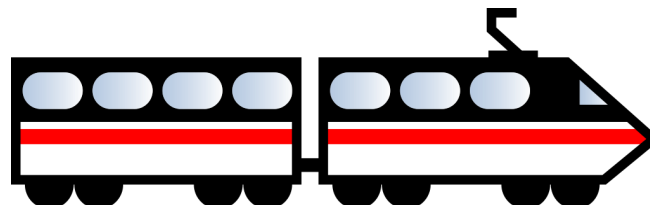
Year 5 pupils joined other schools from across the city at Liverpool Football Club for a special UK Safer Internet Centre Workshop on 5th February.

The children explored 'consent' in an online world, identifying the possible issues that could arise if you give consent or permission to something on a device without seeking advice.

Pupils were selected to feature in a BBC news report about online safety and screen time. The children were given a unique opportunity to become part of the BBC crew, filming the clips and taking recordings (including setting up microphones) for the news item, which was featured on BBC's news on Thursday 7th February 2019.

As well as trying their hand at media production, pupils also met players from the Liverpool F.C. Women's team and some youth players from the men's team.

The Nursery children visited Fazakerley train station as part of their learning and development. The children were given the opportunity to learn about how the train station operates, how to remain safe and what equipment is used within the ticket office.

The children talked to the staff on the platform about their interest focus, asked questions about what they need to include in our role play area and we took photographs to take back to our learning environment. The children were lucky enough to be given the opportunity to ride the train to Kirkby station, talking to the conductor on arrival. As a class, the children have worked together using the resources, information and materials collected to construct their own train station role play area and a train which is displayed in the Nursery reading area.
