

How to Survive in Space...



Having watched the videos on the Y5 Learning at Home link, have a go at creating your very own 'How to Survive in Space' leaflet. You can either print off the template attached, design a leaflet on your own computing device or use paper and card.

Remember, you want this to be as eye catching as possible but easy to read. Therefore, think about your layout.

For example:

Bold heading

Subheadings for different categories/paragraphs

Use of bullet points

Pictures

Diagrams

Quick fact boxes

The content...

Your information must be factual. Also, try to use as much subject specific vocabulary as possible.

Start with an introduction – a brief paragraph of what the leaflet is about. Remember that this paragraph really needs to capture the interest of the reader, you want them to keep reading! You could think about using a rhetorical question or trying to create an image in the readers mind. Have a look at the example below taken from the BBC website.

You might have dreamed of floating in space: the **International Space Station** glinting in the sunshine beside you and the earth hanging below. It might sound like a beautiful and calm place, but space comes with a serious health warning.
