our community.






Historical sources in Year 3 History!

The children examined different sources of evidence to help develop their understand about the Colosseum.






Gymnastics expertise in Year 2!

Well done Year 2!














Shape success in Year 1!

Combining printing and mathematics, the children used 3D shapes to complete printed sequences.






Primary Reception School Applications

All about 5 in Reception!


It has been all about 5 in Reception over recent weeks! The children have been exploring the composition of 5 and used their knowledge to create number sentences.

Nursery continued exploring their mathematical understanding with the support of Numicon. They even managed to fit in a spot of Christmas tree decorating!




Getting up close with teeth in Y4 Science!


Our Year 4 pupils have been taking a closer look at teeth in Science this month.

The children examined the purpose of molar, incisor and canine teeth, exploring their shape, location and function.

They created models and explained their model using scientific vocabulary.







Where does food go? With Year 4!

Developing their scientific understanding even further, our year 4 pupils developed their own models of the human digestive system. They explored each stage of the digestive process and used their models to explain wheat they had learnt.

Year 4 have been busy exploring seasonal ingredients and different types of soup. The children used a range of cutting implements including knives, greeters and peelers as part of the preparation stage. They evaluated their product and identified improvements to their recipe.










Year 6 working with the LFC Foundation

Update on Key Stage 2 SATs Dates

Gov.uk have confirmed that an additional bank holiday in honour of the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III will take place on Monday 8 May 2023.

As this date had previously been announced as the first day of the 2023 key stage 2 (KS2) test week in England, gov.uk have confirmed that a change to the KS2 test schedule next year will be necessary.

The new KS2 SATs schedule will be:

Tuesday 9 May: EGPS papers 1 (questions) & 2 (spelling)

Wednesday 10 May: English Reading paper

Thursday 11 May: Mathematics papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)

Friday 12 May: Mathematics paper 3 (reasoning)

Spare Hangers


Do you have any spare clothes hangers that you no longer need? If so, please send them in to our school office. We want to use them in our upcoming 'Preloved' Uniform Shop.


If you haven't already, please download the StudyBugs App and register your child at: https://studybugs.com/about/parents
