Doors open at 8:45am with lessons starting promptly at 9:00am. Registers close at 9:00am.



Please ensure your child arrives at school in time to be through the door **before 9:00am**, to ensure they are in class on time.

Doors must close at 9:00am prompt to enable support staff to arrive to lessons on time.

Pupils entering through the main entrance from 9:00am will be marked late. Any late pupils must be escorted to the main entrance by their adult, in order to ensure they arrive safely and have their attendance registered.



Parking



Thank you to the many parents and carers who have supported us in trying to keep our school car park safe, by not using it at all for parking.

Unfortunately, we still have a small number of parents/carers who continue to try to use the school car park for their own purposes which has been captured on CCTV.

This is not permitted - by doing so you are risking the safety of others.

The car park is for <u>staff only</u>. It is not permitted for parents / carers to drop off or collect from the car park. This includes <u>not</u> being used for Breakfast Club, morning Club or After School Club.

If you are dropping off at the Children's Centre Nursery drop off zone, you must exit the car park to drop off at school.
