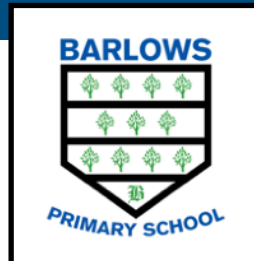

We are delighted to offer our Year 5 and Year 6 pupils, who have not yet completed the course previously, a further opportunity to complete Level 1 and Level 2 Bikeability training with BikeRight.



The sessions take place on the Barlows site and in the local community with a focus on safe bicycle travel for pupils.

Pupils should be able to ride unaided (without the support of stabilisers) to qualify for the sessions. Pupils are also required to have a roadworthy bicycle and helmet to use for the sessions.

If you believe your child would benefit from these sessions and can ride unaided but does not have a bicycle or a helmet, please contact the school office to see how we can support participation with a small number of bicycles and helmets available to borrow from BikeRight. 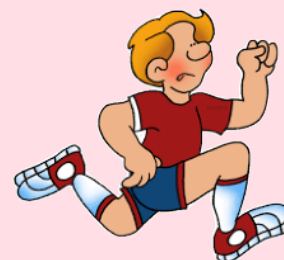

The session will enable children to learn more about Swift programming language using Swift Playground on iPad.

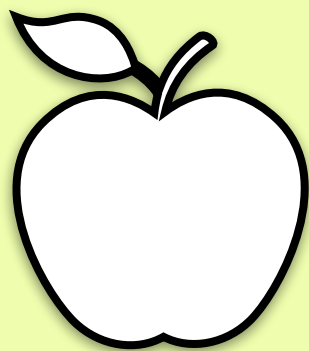

This is a fantastic opportunity to speak to professionals to discuss any advice and questions you may have.



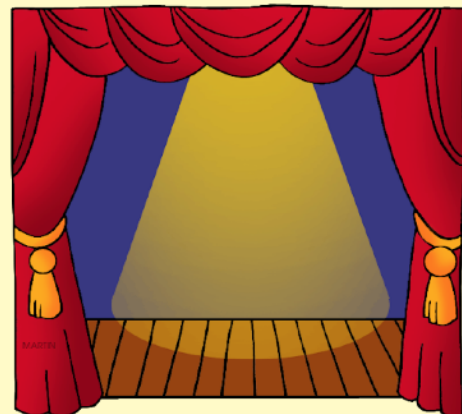

As part of their personal development education, we are pleased to announce that Year 5 and 6 pupils will be attending an online career conversation on Thursday 15/01/26.

Pupils will meet Simon Biltcliffe, founder of Webmart and a pioneering entrepreneur known for building a purpose-led business, championing creativity, values-driven leadership and doing business differently, and Emma Armitage, managing director at Excel Water and an innovative leader driving growth, problem-solving and sustainability in the utilities sector, showing how ideas, resilience and teamwork power successful businesses. ## CUSP ART Festival at Barlows Primary School WC 26/01/26

Between 26th-30th January 2026, our pupils will be taking part in a week long Art festival as part of our CUSP curriculum. The festival will further enhance the knowledge and skills our pupils have developed in our Art and Design curriculum through further exploration of key artists and their impact of the world around us. Pupils will become 'a little more expert' in Art and Design as they revisit skills previously taught and apply them to new, creative contexts.

The theme for this year's event is "Art, Technology and the World Around Us".

There will be a range of events on offer to support pupils in developing their knowledge and skills in Art & Design. Pupils will take part in 'Meet the Artist' workshops, visit digital exhibitions and create their own digital art to share with other participants in the festival.

During 'Meet the Artist' sessions, pupils will explore the work of the following artists and understand how they use technology in their art:

### Year 6 CUSP ART Festival WC 26/01/26

Year 6 will 'Meet the Artist' Lucy Stuteley - storyteller, artist and illustrator, who will explain how she uses technology in her work in children's literature.

Year 6 will be set the challenge of creating digital art which showcases their editing skills.

Pupils in Year 6 will also develop their drawing and textiles knowledge and skills by applying wax to the surface of fabric and dying it to create coloured designs and effects as well as using a range of mark making tools to add detail and tone in their sketches. Pupils will use technology to create layered montages of the work they create as part of the festival.

Pupils will share their creations with other schools participating in the festival via an online virtual exhibition.



### Year 5 CUSP ART Festival WC 26/01/26

Year 5 will 'Meet the Artist' Lucy Stuteley - storyteller, artist and illustrator, who will explain how she uses technology in her work.

Year 5 will be set the challenge of creating digital art which showcases their editing skills.

Pupils in Year 5 will also further enhance their printmaking and textiles skills and knowledge by creating reduction prints, combining fabrics in a variety of ways and weaving, braiding and constructing art with natural materials. Pupils will use iPad to capture and manipulate images of flowers using art and picture effects to replicate printing techniques.

Pupils will share their creations with other schools participating in the festival via an online virtual exhibition.



### Year 4 CUSP ART Festival WC 26/01/26

Year 4 will 'Meet the Artist', Annie Culley-Tea who will discuss 'What is art? And why is it so important to the world?.'

Year 4 will be set the challenge of taking a range of photographs that are inspiring to them.

Pupils in Year 4 will also further develop their skills in textiles and drawing by using cross-hatching to create shaded areas in their work and then practicing using a running stitch to combine media to create texture.

Pupils will share their creations with other schools participating in the festival via an online virtual exhibition.





# Events in January 2026

## **Year 3 CUSP ART Festival WC 26/01/26**

Year 3 will 'Meet the Artist', photographer Ed Clark, who will explain how he uses digital tools in his art.

Year 3 will be set the challenge of taking a range of photographs that are inspiring to them.

Pupils in Year 3 will also further develop their skills in painting and print making by using the painting techniques of impasto, tonking and sgraffito and then creating an impressed stamp as a printing tool. Pupils will apply this to technology by children recreating their work in drawing software through layering.

Pupils will share their creations with other schools participating in the festival via an online virtual exhibition.



## **Year 2 CUSP ART Festival WC 26/01/26**

Year 2 will 'Meet the Artist' Dr Steve Bunce, an Apple Specialist, who will explore how we can be inspired by the world around us when creating examples of Digital Art.

Year 2 will be set the challenge of taking a photograph to demonstrate unity and togetherness.

Pupils in Year 2 will also create a collaged circle using a range of textured papers and materials before then creating a digital collage in the Freeform App with a focus on layer, colour and texture.

Pupils will share their creations with other schools participating in the festival via an online virtual exhibition.



## **Year 1 CUSP ART Festival WC 26/01/26**

Year 1 will 'Meet the Artist' Dr Steve Bunce, an Apple Specialist, who will explore how we can be inspired by the world around us when creating examples of Digital Art.

Year 1 will be set the challenge of taking a photograph to demonstrate unity and togetherness.

Pupils in Year 1 will also create work combining their drawing and technology skills. Pupils will use a range of mark makers to create a variety of effects on different surfaces. Pupils will use the Camera App on iPad to take an image and make marks on it using mark up tools focusing on control.

Pupils will share their creations with other schools participating in the festival via an online virtual



## **Early Years CUSP ART Festival WC 26/01/26**

Pupils in Reception will explore the Tate Kids Virtual Art gallery to take inspiration from artists working in different ways.

They will be set the challenge of taking a photograph that wows us, inspired by their own interests or something they are proud of.

Pupils will share their creative work with other schools participating in the festival via an online virtual exhibition.



## **Year 5 & Year 6 Children's University Online Masterclass - Shakespeare North Playhouse Wednesday 28/01/26**

This online Children's University Masterclass session for our Year 5 and Year 6 pupils, will be led by Shakespeare North Playhouse and will look at how Shakespeare has influenced and infiltrated our English language.

For example, did you know that he invented the words 'eyeball', 'puke' and 'suspicious'?

The session will use the play 'A midsummer Night's Dream' as a starting point for developing children's understanding of the history of some of the English language.
